Works Cited page as well as in-text

Book by one author:

Pollack, William. *Real Boys' Voices*. New York: Random, 2000. Print

In-text: (Pollack 108).

Or According to Pollack boys have loud voices (23).

Book by more than one author:

Smith, John, and Susan Jones. *When Reading a Book and How to Cite it Correctly*. Hudsonbay: Wadsworth, 2010. Print.

In-text: (Smith and Jones 12-13).

When there are four or more authors use et al. after naming the first author:

Smith, John, et al. *When Reading a Book and How to Cite it Correctly*. Hudsonbay: Wadsworth, 2010. Print.

In-text: (Smith et al. 12-13).

Electronic Book via a Database:

Smith, John. *How to Read a Book*. Ebrary books, 2011. Web. 9 Oct. 2012.

In-text: (Smith 210) **if there is no pagination then identity by chapter** (Smith, ch.2).

An original selection in an edited collection, chapter or anthology:

Pollan, Michael. "Food Fight." *Elements of Argument: A Text and Reader*. 10th ed. Eds. Annette T. Rottenberg and Donna Haisty Winchell. Boston: Bedford/St. Martin's, 2011. 576-580. Print.

In-text: (Pollan 577).
